F. COUNCIL UPDATES/ROUNDTABLE

F.1 Wayne Bokenfohr, Councillor, Division 3

Councillor Bokenfohr updated Council on his recent activities, which included:

- *Attendance at the Joint Task Force Committee in St. Albert;
- *Attendance at the Alberta Library Conference. It was a very different atmosphere than last year and it's nice to see things on a positive scale;
- *Attendance at the Alberta Planning Conference in Red Deer. There were very good courses and talks. One takeaway from one of the branding consultants at the conference is that making a place safe for women means everyone will come; and
- *Attendance at the Council workshop in Stony Plain. While it was good and we accomplished a fair bit, it was sad to see the hotel also being used as emergency housing for displaced people from the wildfire evacuations.

F.2 Jerry Kaup, Councillor, Division 4

Councillor Kaup updated Council on his recent activities, which included:

- *Attendance at St. Albert workshop. It was interesting and nice to see everyone work together; and
- *Attendance at the very productive Council workshop in Stony Plain.

F.3 Patrick Tighe, Councillor, Division 5

Councillor Tighe updated Council on his recent activities which included:

*Attendance at many of the same of the same activities, including attendance at the Inter-municipal Affairs Committee (IAC) meeting with St. Albert, where he was very encouraged that the communication was relatively open and flowing between the two groups;

*Attendance at the planning conference in Red Deer. The conference was very good and had some relative, excellent information. Two takeaways from the conference were the talks on the annexation process, which is relative to our region, and also the use of drones or remote operating vehicles and aircraft;

*Attendance at the Council workshop in Stony Plain, which was very nicely done. We had a tour of the renovated Parkland Public Works building, as well as the new Spruce Grove Public Works building which incorporated some LEED building practices and functional/operational guidelines;

*Met with a number of residents on some issues.

*On approximately April 28, 2016, there was some vandalism done to the plaques at the Bon Accord and District Veterans Memorial Park. This is a very sad situation, and hopefully the individuals that were involved in the defacing have a better understanding that this is similar to vandalism in a cemetery. It will be costly to replace/repair the plaques.

F.4 Karen Shaw, Councillor, Division 6

Councillor Shaw updated Council on her recent activities, which included:

*Thanked staff for the tour of the facilities in Parkland, as it gives us some good ideas moving forward;

*Dealing with some dumping issues, which Councillor Shaw has sent a Council request in. There continues to be dumping on 580, and local residents have been cleaning it up for years. Part of it belongs to the neighbouring municipality, and a lot of the dumping is by residents of the Town of Redwater. Should we be looking at some potential solutions working with the three municipalities to how we could deal with this problem, as we are spending lot of resources cleaning up dumping site;

*Participating in Coronado community and church cleanup. They have a new AGM and a new group of committed land owners there with young families. She noted that many were absolutely shocked to see a County Councillor helping out;

*Thanked Administration for communication in our new County Connections. There is a lot of good information in there. It just keeps improving;

*Wished to send a huge thank you and commend the firefighters and first responders who are helping out with the Fort McMurray wildfire situation; and

*Spending a significant amount of time reading all of the CRB material

F.5 Ferd Caron, Councillor, Division 1

Councillor Caron was not present for Council Updates/Roundtable.

F.6 Susan Evans, Councillor, Division 2

Councillor Evans updated Council on her recent activities, which included: *Attendance at Capital Region Board (CRB) Transit Committee in Red Deer on April 28, 2016, which was between the CRB and Calgary Regional Partnership and was organized by Alberta Transportation. It was gratifying to see the Minister of Transportation, Brian Mason, there. A number of items were brought forward, in particular talking about a provincial transit strategy. We had an opportunity to put forward our priorities in the region. Some interesting things came from the meeting. Through the CRB Transit Committee, we do green trip funding and prioritize projects, and the Minister of Transportation noted that they are looking at doing something different from the green trip. One comment was that in the room were a number of municipalities looking at doing transportation on their own, and the Minister suggested that if they were planning on doing that, they may not or probably would not get funded. Also took part in a telephone coversation on May 9, 2016, with respect to CRB Transportation. They are pulling together information with respect to what are the priorities and how do we link that to land planning that's going on; *Attendance at the Capital Regional Board Land Use and Planning Committee meeting; *Attendance at the Community Planning Association of Alberta conference in Red Deer. It was such a great conference and relevant with respect to what the County is going through right now. In particular, there were a lot of conversations and presentations with respect to annexation. Also provided good level of comfort and reconfirmation of the direction we're going through, through the advice of our Administration with respect to doing the growth plan study with our municipality through the IAC and building upon that. These kinds of discussions, as both the public and the people at the table have to understand, are not quick discussions. Also had an opportunity to touch base with a few Councillors from rural municipalities with respect to what they do with regard to dust suppression and review some of their policies;

*Participated in a teleconference meeting of the Public Awareness Working group of the Alberta Seniors Community and Housing Association on May 9, 2016. The group is working on terms of reference and looking at standardizing terms and educating the public and other stakeholders, in order to be more consistent and reduce confusion; and *Attended a number of garbage pick-up sessions with community associations.

F.7 Mayor Tom Flynn

Mayor Flynn updated Council on his recent activities, which included:

*Attended Edmonton Prayer Breakfast on April 27, 2016. The keynote speaker was an indigenous gentleman who spoke of his background and how his faith has helped him; *Attended the IAC meetings in St. Albert; sat at IAC. We are working well together to bring the region together in the future;

*Attended the Land Use meeting for Capital Region Board. We had a presentation from the Deputy Minister of Transportation, Greg Bass, who indicated support for the Regional Transportation Master Plan that was approved. The only adjustment done to presentation was to separate the transit priorities from other road priorities so that they keep funding from getting muddled;

*Attended the Planning Conference and participated in a number of valuable presentations. Believes the region could benefit from a seminar on annexation, because a number of councillors in our towns and regions need some understanding of the process. There was an excellent presentation from a professor of planning from the University of Calgary, which talked a lot about a model that is exactly what the County is doing with St. Albert:

*The Province is bringing out the draft of the *Municipal Government Act* towards end of May. There will be a number of opportunities for us to participate and hear some of the updates over the first few weeks of June - these are listed on the *MGA* Review website, and it would be good for members of Council to attend a session. There will be opportunities to attend throughout the province, including Edmonton. Mayor Flynn has registered to attend one in Hinton at the end of June; and

*The CRB is planning Regional Road Show Presentations to talk about the road plan, similar to what was done a year ago. The County is hosting one on June 15, 2016, at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers.
