Request for Decision

2018 Community Association Grant Allocations Title 1. That Council ratify the Calahoo Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Extraction **Proposed Motion** Committee motion to award the 2018 Grants in the amount of \$160,673 to the community groups identified in the attached summary and committee minutes of March 26, 2018. 2. That Council ratify the Community Services Advisory Board motion to award the 2018 Grants in the amount of \$137,465 to the community groups identified in the attached summary and committee minutes of March 12, 2018. 3. That Council approve an additional award in the amount of \$24,577.59 from the Sturgeon Industrial Community Fund Reserve to ensure all the priority capital projects can be funded. Administrative Administration recommends approval of the Council Committee Recommendation recommendations. These recommendations were debated extensively and unanimously supported by both Council Committees during their respective meetings in March 2018. **Previous Council** December 2017 - Motion 506/17 **Direction** That Council approve the 2018 Operating and Capital Budget as amended. **Background Information** Report The Community Association Grant policy was last reviewed and updated in 2016. The Committees reviewed each application against the eligibility criteria and merit of the application. The funding decisions are not easy given the fact that each year we receive requests that exceed the funds available. The recommendations being made are reflective of our key principles of accountability, diversity of opportunities and volunteerism. The application deadline was Friday, February 16, 2018. 32 organizations submitted applications which is the same as 2017. Total requests equaled \$415,114.66 and the total funding available was \$298,138.

- 5 non-recognized groups applied; 1 group was deemed ineligible
 and none of the 5 groups received funding.
- In relation to the third proposed motion:
 - During 2014 and 2015 operating budget deliberations, two consecutive operating service enhancements were approved (OP11 in 2014 and OP05 in 2015) for \$100,000 in each year to provide more sufficient funding and equal access to grant funds for community associations across the jurisdiction.
 - In 2016 (\$22,500), 2017 (\$33,250) and again in 2018 (\$24,578), we made a conscious decision to respond to need versus arbitrarily increase the budget amount and deplete the reserve.
 - The additional \$24,578 will ensure that the highest priority projects can be funded in support of the volunteer efforts.

External Communication

 There has been no external communication regarding the grant program other than the application deadlines.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Community Identity & Spirit – This Community Association Grant Program is a demonstration of the County's commitment to actively support and work in collaboration with voluntary organizations in the region.

Organizational:

There is no impact organizationally. The grant program and deliberations at the committee level is core work and anticipated annually in the workplans of affected staff.

Financial:

No financial impact. The grant funding is approved as part of the annual operating budget. There are sufficient funds in the reserve to cover the recommended expenditure and the projects are consistent with the purpose of the reserve.

The recommendations were deliberated by Council Committees. There are no alternatives that Administration considered out of respect for the effort and commitment of the Committees and their mandates.
