Request for Decision

Title	Lamoureux Drive Drainage - Phase 2 - Realignment - Contract Award Recommendation		
Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the realignment and reconstruction of Lamoureux Drive to G&J Parking Lot Maintenance LP at a contract price of \$149,169.36 (not including GST).		
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends Council award the contract for the realignment and reconstruction of Lamoureux Drive to G&J Parking Lot Maintenance LP at a contract price of \$149,169.36 (not including GST) with an overall project budge estimated to be \$495,000.

Report	Background Information • Sturgeon County hired Stewart Weir in 2013 to provide: inspection.		

- Sturgeon County hired Stewart Weir in 2013 to provide: inspection, assessment, preliminary design and cost estimate for installation of culverts and restoration along Lamoureux Drive.
- The study found 23 culverts along the road had inadequate rip rap or other mechanism of energy dissipation at their outfalls.
- The study identified erosion and scouring of the riverbank near several culvert outfall locations.
- The most severe scour area was south of the intersection with Range Rd. 224.
- This section of road has eroded to a point where public safety was a concern and the road was closed.
- Sturgeon County went through the Proposal process for Engineering Services in August 2016 and awarded a contract to Opus Stewart Weir in September 2016.
- While the Procurement Policy requires Council's approval on contracts greater than \$500,000, given the significance and history of the Lamoureux Drive road closure, Administration decided to bring forward this RFD now.

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Tendering

- Tenders were received on the above-noted project on March 29, 2017 at the County Center from twelve (12) contractors.
- The lowest bid was from G&J Parking Lot Maintenance LP with a total tender amount of \$149,169.36 (Tender summary is attached).

External Communication

- The Tender was advertised from March 7 to 29, 2017.
- The Tender for this project was advertised on:
 - Alberta Purchasing Connection
 - Cool Net

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- Procurement Policy PRD_PRO_FI_2014 states that the lowest bid meeting
 the tender or request for proposal requirements and/or specifications will
 normally be accepted. Justification in writing along with recommendation
 must be submitted if the lowest bidder is not selected. Normally, the only
 reasons acceptable for selecting any but the lowest bidder would be:
 - o Low bidder does not meet the specifications.
 - o Low bidder cannot deliver within the required time.
 - The quality of performance of previous contracts or services may be in question.
 - The acceptance of low bid would result in higher overall end costs (such as operating or life cycle costs).
 - The ability, capacity, experience and efficiency of the bidder.
- Once the tender or request for proposal has been selected, all necessary contractual agreements, conditions, terms, documents, etc. will be completed and the tender or contract will be awarded.
- The opening of tenders or requests for proposals must be done in public tender meetings; tenders of \$500,000 in value or exceeding \$500,000 in aggregate value must be ratified at the following Council meeting.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

- <u>Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership</u> The awarding of this contract would be consistent with Sturgeon County's procurement policy and support the Sturgeon County 4 Stage Capital Plan.
- <u>Community Identity & Spirit</u> Awarding this contract will promote Sturgeon County with local residents due to the nature of the work associated with this project.
- <u>Planned Growth</u> This project considers cumulative costs and long term funding implications associated with the management of this infrastructure asset.
- Maintain and Enhance Strong Communities The realignment and reconstruction of Lamoureux Drive will demonstrate a commitment to the community that Sturgeon County is committed to maintaining and updating existing infrastructure as this road is currently closed.

Date Written: March 29, 2017 Council Meeting Date: April 25, 2017 Operational Excellence – The realignment and reconstruction of Lamoureux Drive (Phase 2) as well as drainage improvements (Phase 3) will reduce future maintenance costs and allow transportation resources to be reallocated to other priority projects.

- Sturgeon County Engineering Services has retained Opus Stewart Weir to provide preliminary engineering, design, land acquisition, tender and project management services for this Contract.
- Opus Stewart Weir will also be responsible for providing contract administration, quality assurance and materials testing services for the project.
- This project has been broken into the following Phases:
 - Phase 1 Detailed Design (2016).
 - o Phase 2 Road Realignment and Erosion Mitigation (2017).
 - o Phase 3 Remaining Drainage Improvements (2018).
- Scope of this contract includes:
 - o Realignment of approximately 300 m of road.
 - Erosion Mitigation of existing bank.
