Report	Background Information
	The 2018 Taxation Rates Bylaw proposes a 0.49% increase in property taxes, the same percentage increase presented in the budget.
	Sturgeon County's actual assessment is greater overall than the estimated assessment when the 2018 budget was set.
	• In accordance with the Summary of Fiscal Principles, Practices and Policies, Sturgeon County takes a conservative approach to estimating assessment for budget purposes.
	The additional assessment will allow Sturgeon County to fund the General Operating Reserve for future purposes.
	• A median valued home of \$445,765 will see a \$4 increase to property taxes in 2018 for municipal, education and seniors.
	•

- Municipal taxes are the most important single source of revenue for Sturgeon County. Approximately 78% of operating revenues in 2018 will be derived from municipal property taxes
- Assessments used for budget purposes are estimated approximately six (6) months prior to the availability of final figures. The estimate is required to gain an understanding of the net impact the budget will have on property taxation in the County.
- As was the case in the 2017 Taxation Rates Bylaw, a minimum tax of \$25
 is included in the 2018 taxation year to address the cost of assessing and
 maintaining tax records on properties that pay less than \$25 in
 municipal taxes.
- The Bylaw and associated recommendations are currently written in a manner that is consistent with the Summary of Fiscal Principles, Practices and Policies approved by Motion 360/13 on August 27, 2013

Requisitions

- The Alberta School Foundation Fund requisition increased by 10%; the impact to the median County home will be approximately a \$4 decrease versus an increase of \$78 previously estimated due to assessment increase.
- The Sturgeon Seniors Foundation increased by 8%. The median home owner will see a decrease of \$1 versus the budget estimated \$1 increase.

External Communication

- Tax notices will be mailed Wednesday, May 23, 2018 (Financial Services).
- An advertisement will be placed in local papers and on the County's website notifying rate payers that notices have been mailed (Communications).

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Organizational:

Due date for tax payments will be June 29, 2018. Printing of tax notices will commence early May.

Combined tax/assessment notices must be ready for mailing May 23, 2018. Assessment complaints must be submitted to the County by July 30, 2018.

Financial:

- The County will raise \$ 66,297,069 in total property tax revenue including requisitions (Note: 2017 \$61 million).
- General municipal property taxes amount to \$49,346,827 (Note: 2017 \$45 million).
- A 0.49% increase in taxes as proposed in the Bylaw will generate new net tax revenue of \$36,098 as a result of increased assessments.
- The 2018 Sturgeon Foundation requisition of \$642,749 which increased by 8% has been received (Note 2017 \$594,486).
- The 2018 Alberta School Foundation requisition of \$16,270,246 increased by 10% (Note: 2017 \$14,745,306).

Alternatives Considered

1. That Council increase taxes by 0.42% to raise the 2018 budgeted tax revenue.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

Unknown – alternative dependent.

Organizational:

Due date for tax payments will be June 29, 2018. Printing of tax notices will commence early May.

Combined tax/assessment notices must be ready for mailing May 23, 2018. Assessment complaints must be submitted by July 30, 2018.

Financial:

• Alternative 1 will increase tax rates by 0.42%. This will generate tax revenue of \$49,312,103, which will only be sufficient to meet budget.

Follow up Action

1. Bring Bylaw 1406/18 to April 24, 2018 meeting for second and third reading.
