Report	Background Information
	Sturgeon County is a progressive municipality that has recognized the need to become more advanced and sophisticated in conducting business within Council Chambers. Traditional methods of recording votes can be cumbersome for legislative staff, oftentimes slowing the pace of meetings.
	Currently because of physical set up, limitations in visibility and human error the Chair can run into issues in determining talking order, ensuring that each Council member is heard from on a topic and that each member is able to bring forward the motions they were planning to bring forward.
	When Sturgeon County initially moved to the Granicus System in 2014, the meeting management system was adequate in its simplistic form. Now that Administration and Council have grasped the basic functionality of the system, Council is ready to move towards a more sophisticated way to coordinate speaking order and perform voting by expanding the system functionality of Granicus. The VoteCast application will provide clarity and consistency on capturing the voting for the Legislative Services department.
	The VoteCast add-on was funded as a part of the Information Services operating budget in 2017 at no additional cost to the Sturgeon County Budget.

November 7, 2017 November 28, 2017 VoteCast modernizes the voting process by eliminating the inconsistency of hand counting. Principally the convenience of tablet voting is simple and easy to perform by users. Also, the addition of VoteCast further streamlines the meeting process. We are confident that this enhancement will be relatively simple for Council to navigate during the meetings. Further, there is the ability to track the timing of the speakers to ensure fairness.

We will now be mirroring the practices already in place in municipalities such as Strathcona County, Parkland County (in progress), City of Fort Saskatchewan, City of St. Albert and City of Edmonton, just to name a few within our region. It is important to stay current with the technologies available to ensure we are providing a consistent and repeated level of services to the residents.

Therefore, legislatively, in order to moved forward with this change in process within the Council meetings, there is a requirement to update the Council Meeting Procedure Bylaw 1301/13.

As noted, within the amending Bylaw 1392/17 attached, there are two (2) relatively minor changes that are required for approval to allow for the use of technology to request to speak and to vote during our Council meetings.

The 2018 Business Plan includes the intent to undertake a broader review and amendment of the Proceeding Bylaw. These limited amendments are required to enable use of VoteCast in the short term.
