## Request for Decision

# Title Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program Contract Award Recommendation

#### **Proposed Motion**

- 1. That Council award the multi-year contract (2017 2019) for the Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program to E-Construction Ltd., at a contract price of \$9,949,016.88 (not including GST).
- 2. That Council fund the \$500,000 shortfall by rescheduling BF9433 from construction in 2018 to construction in 2019.

# Administrative Recommendation

Administration recommends that Council award the multi-year contract for the Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program to E-Construction Ltd. as they were the lowest compliant bidder and met all the criteria.

# Previous Council Direction

December 13, 2016 – Motion 455/16:

That Council approve the 2017 Operating and Capital Budget as presented in the 2017 Budget Document.

June 28, 2016 – Motion 239/16:

That Council approve the projects in Stage 4 - Construction above the red line for the 2017 construction season.

#### Report

#### **Background Information**

The Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program contains the following projects:

#### Reconstruction

Range Road 233 From Hillsborough Heights (South) to Township Road 572

- Total length of reconstruction is 1.6 kilometres.
- Average width of the road is 7.0 metres.
- Sight lines at intersections and swamp need improvement.
- Major Swamp located on both sides of road.
- Average maintenance costs range between \$2,000 to \$3,000 per
   1.6 kilometres.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2017.

- Total length of reconstruction is 1.7 kilometres.
- Average width of the road is 7.0 metres.
- This road has minor vertical alignment issues.
- Average maintenance costs range between \$2,000 to \$3,000 per
   1.6 kilometres.
- Traffic Counts from 2014 indicate 331 vehicles per day.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2017.

Township Road 572 Phase 2 From Lily Lake Road (Range Road 235) to Range Road 233

- Total length of reconstruction is 3.2 kilometres.
- Average width of the road is 7.0 metres.
- This road has minor vertical alignment issues.
- Average maintenance costs range between \$2,000 to \$3,000 per
   1.6 kilometres.
- Traffic Counts from 2014 indicate 331 vehicles a day.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2017.

#### **Surfacing**

Township Road 570 From Range Road 233 to Highway 28

- Total length of surfacing is 1.6 kilometres.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2016/2017.
- Road is programmed to be surfaced in 2018.

Range Road 233 From Township Road 570 to Hillsborough Heights (South)

- Total length of surfacing is 1.6 kilometres.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2016/2017.
- Road is programmed to be surfaced in 2018.

Range Road 233 From Hillsborough Heights (South) to Township Road 573

- Total length of surfacing is 3.3 kilometres.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2017.
- Road is programmed to be surfaced in 2018.

Date Written: Ju Council Meeting Date: Ju Township Road 572 From Lily Lake Road (Range Road 235) to Highway 28

- Total length of surfacing is 5.0 kilometres.
- Road is programmed to be rebuilt in 2017/2018.
- Road is programmed to be surfaced in 2019.
- Sturgeon County's Procurement Process guides that the lowest bid meeting the tender or request for proposal requirements and/or specifications will normally be accepted.
- E-Construction Ltd. was the lowest compliant bidder.

#### **External Communication**

- Lily Lake area residents were sent letters on March 29, 2017, informing them of the work in the area, as well as future phasing and timing.
   Follow-up communications will be coordinated between the Contractor and Administration.
- Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program was tendered through the Alberta Purchasing Connection on April 5, 2017. Tenders closed on April 25, 2017 at 11:00 a.m.
- We received nine (9) bids ranging from \$9,949,016.88 to \$12,507,345.14 (excluding GST).
- Opus Stewart Weir (OSW), engineering consultant, reviewed tenders and recommends Sturgeon County award the contract for Lily Lake Area Reconstruction and Surfacing Program to E-Construction Ltd.

## Implication of Administrative Recommendation

#### Strategic Alignment:

<u>Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership</u> – The awarding of this contract would be consistent with Sturgeon County's procurement policy and support Sturgeon County's 4-Stage Capital Plan.

<u>Community Identity & Spirit</u> – Awarding this contract will promote Sturgeon County with local residents due to the nature of the work associated with this project.

<u>Planned Growth</u> – This project considers cumulative costs and long-term funding implications associated with the management of this infrastructure asset.

<u>Maintain and Enhance Strong Communities</u> – The reconstruction and surfacing of the Lily Lake Area Program will demonstrate a commitment to the community that Sturgeon County is committed to maintaining and updating existing infrastructure.

<u>Operational Excellence</u> – The reconstruction and surfacing of the Lily Lake Area Program will reduce future maintenance costs and allow transportation resources to be re-allocated to other priority projects as well.

Sturgeon County Engineering Services has committed resources to deliver these projects as part of the 4-Stage Capital Plan.

Engineering costs for 2018 & 2019 surfacing construction are based on estimates only. A RFP for construction services will be issued in the Fall 2017.

There is a funding shortfall of \$500,000, which Administration recommends addressing by re-scheduling BF 9433 from the 2018 construction season to 2019.

## **Alternatives** Considered

That Council not award the contract at this time.

## Implications of **Alternatives**

#### **Strategic Alignment:**

Not awarding a contract may be inconsistent with past Sturgeon County practices and procedures.

#### Organizational:

To date, Sturgeon County has allocated resources and effort in coordinating the reconstruction and surfacing of this program.

#### Financial:

If the contract was not awarded, Sturgeon County would still be responsible for the engineering costs to date which are estimated to be \$160,000.
