Mayor Flynn opened the public hearing at 1:33 p.m. regarding Bylaw1346/15 and 1347/15, reviewing the process that would occur for the public hearing and introducing members of Council and Administration that were in attendance.

Clayton Kittlitz, Manager and Craig Walker, Planning Officer Planning and Development Services provided an overview of the proposed Bylaws 1346/15 and 1347/15 and summarized the content contained in the Briefing Note which is on file.

Councillor Bokenfohr joined the meeting at 1:59 p.m.

Greg MacKenzie, Greg MacKenzie and Associates Consulting Ltd., the Planner for the Outline Plan, Ray Watkins of Watkins Land Developments and Amin Somani, Meridian Pacific JV Ltd. were in attendance to discuss the proposal.

In response to questions, Mr. MacKenzie advised Council that the name of the business is not set in stone and can be changed if required. Transportation improvements would include realignment, street lights and acceleration and deceleration lanes. They are confident that they can work with Alberta Transportation on both the immediate and long term concepts for transportation improvements. Water supply would be dependent on what the land usage is and the Outline Plan speaks to many options but, they are confident that the truck and coffee shops can be accommodated with a private system. They have had discussions with a water commission north of the site but these discussions are on-going. Everything that would be done would meet the County's General Municipal Servicing Standards and through that process it would be established if a pipe service is needed, prior to coming to Council for approval. Overnight accommodations currently do not exist in the plans. They will ensure that fuel storage will be within accordance of the regulations. They have not considered another site for this project. They do not expect an increase of traffic because they are not a "go to" location. It is difficult to say whether or not additional services would spur development in the Sturgeon Industrial Park.

Ray Courchesne, Sturgeon County Resident, who resides in the area came forward to express his concerns related to increased traffic. He believes that before projects such as these proceed, road systems should be in place.
