Request for Decision

Title | Morinville Seed Cleaning Plant Loan Receivable

Proposed Motion

- 1. That Council authorize Administration to pursue collection of the May 2016 loan payment in the amount of \$16,698.98 due from the Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-Op Ltd.
- 2. That Council authorize Administration to call the whole of the remaining principle sum and accrued interest of \$64,857 due from the Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-Op Ltd.

Administrative Recommendation

Administration recommends pursuit of collection of the loan from the Co-Op in keeping with fiscal responsibility to Sturgeon County.

Accountability and contractual obligation for the payment of the loan belongs to the Co-Op, and the Co-Op has not responded to requests related to the repayment of the loan.

Previous Council Direction

July 12, 2016 - Motion 259/16

That Council approves a deadline extension of the loan payment to September 30, 2016 to provide time for the Seed Cleaning Co-Op to make the appropriate request for forgiveness.

June 23, 2015 - Motion 217/15

That County Council approves the request by the Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-Op Ltd. For forgiveness on their May 1, 2015 loan repayment of \$16,700.

Report

Background Information

- On April 14, 2009 Sturgeon County Council established Bylaw 1175/09, Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-Op Limited Loan, \$150,000 for the completion of capital upgrades.
- This loan was secured by a promissory note signed with the Corporate Seal, by Directors of the Seed Cleaning Plant on April 17, 2009.
 Conditions of the note for non-payment provide for the "whole of the Principal Sum and accrued interest" to become due and payable in the event that any instalment of interest is not made on its due date.
- Annual loan payments \$16,698.98 including principal and interest, are due May 1 of each year.
- The balance of the loan on Sturgeon County Audited Financial Statements as of December 31, 2015 was \$63,585, accrued interest to May 1, 2016 is \$1,272, total amount owing at May 1, 2016 is \$64,857.

- In 2010, the Co-Op requested forgiveness of the 2010 loan payment, Council granted this request. Since then the Co-Op has requested forgiveness annually, which Council has approved. Notice to Reader Financial Statements have accompanied these requests.
- Over the years 2010 to 2015 Council has made repeated requests through administration that the Co -Op provide Audited Financial Statements; 2015 Audited Statements were provided through Sturgeon County Council representative.
- Administration has been in contact with the Co-Op formally through letter and informally through email and telephone correspondence.
 Formal communication took the form of letters to the plant;
 - April 14, 2016 Forgiveness on the May 1, 2016 Loan Repayment, letter sent as a courtesy reminder that the Co-Op annually applies for forgiveness of the loan payment.
 - June 22, 2016 May 1, 2016 Loan Repayment Past Due, letter advising the loan payment was past due. No official response received though requested by June 30, 2016.
 - July 12, 2016 May 1, 2016 Loan Repayment Past Due, letter advising of Councils extension granted. No response received though requested by September 30, 2016.

External Communication

NA

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- Section 265 of the *Municipal Government Act* provides for a municipality to loan money to a non-profit organization.
- The \$150,000 loan to the Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-Op Limited was authorized by Bylaw 1175/09.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership – collection of the loan payment and loan are consistent with Goal 1.2, Sturgeon County is financially stable and fiscally sustainable.

Organizational:

Authorization to pursue collection of the loan allows Administration to hold organizations accountable to their use of Sturgeon County funds.

Financial:

Collection of the loan payment increases Sturgeon County cash flow by \$16,698.98, collection of the loan increases cash flow by \$64,857 and removes the loan receivable.

Alternatives Considered

- 1. That Sturgeon County waive the May 1, 2016 loan payment without an official request from the Co-Op.
- 2. That Sturgeon County further extend the deadline for the May 1, 2016 loan payment.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

 Both alternatives may be inconsistent with Goal 1.2 Sturgeon County is financially stable and fiscally sustainable.

Organizational:

Though Council has waived the loan payment in the past the Co-Op has
the accountability and contractual obligation to make the loan payment
or request forgiveness of the loan. As this loan is in the form of Bylaw,
Administration alone does not have the authority to forgive the loan
payment or provide extensions without Council direction.

Financial:

• Sturgeon County would not derive cash-flow benefit of \$16,698.98 for the loan payment, or \$64,857 for the full loan amount. The loan remains as a receivable to Sturgeon County.

Follow up Action

- 1. Administration will advise the Co-Op of Councils decision.
- 2. If Council approves the motions as presented Administration will pursue collection of the loan.
