Request for Decision

Legacy Development and Land Use Bylaw Enforcement Proposed Motion 1. That Council receive the attached Legacy Enforcement File report as information. 2. That Council direct staff to schedule a workshop to develop direction and approaches to dealing with legacy developments and enforcement. **Administrative** Administration felt that making assumptions with respect to the intent of Recommendation the motion could be an inefficient use of resources and believes achieving clarity in direction through a workshop is a positive approach to addressing the identified files. **Previous Council** July 10, 2017 - Motion 350/17: Direction That Council direct Administration to investigate into the extent and nature of legacy development and business arrangements that had been entered into or represented to and with ratepayers so that Council has a better understanding of the future related outstanding obligations of Sturgeon County in relation to such arrangements, and that the CAO is to report back to Council in writing outlining the above information by November 28, 2017. Report **Background Information** The subject motion was introduced and passed on July 10, 2017 during Council's debate in considering third reading of Land Use Bylaw 1385/17. The discussion surrounding the motion seemed to be concerning how legacy enforcement files would be dealt with post adoption the Land Use Bylaw. However, the final motion references "legacy development" which could be interpreted to be all development within the County dating back to a time not defined. There needs to be clarity surrounding the terms "business arrangements and representations" to ensure Administration is bringing back the information that Council is looking for. Most of the data that is assumed to be needed to satisfy this motion would be severed by Freedom of Information and Privacy (FOIP) legislation and would most likely provide very little clarity given limited information that could be shared publicly.

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- On October 19, 2016, Administration shared the Legacy Enforcement list
 and details with members of Council in an informal briefing setting.
 (Attachment #1 is a version of what was shared with all personal
 landowner information removed). The intent was to provide details on
 the files and provide some thoughts on how to address the list
 holistically. Administration was to take any feedback and develop
 options to be presented in the Land Use Bylaw Implementation Plan.
- The Implementation Plan was adopted by Council on June 27, 2017 and the direction provided for Legacy Enforcement files was as follows:

Discussion

- In general terms, compliance exists where a standard application and permitting process has been followed and the current use is consistent.
- At present the only data that can be collected and shared is data that exists within Sturgeon County property files.
 - It is possible that a permit was issued but is not available within the County's file. Where a landowner can present this permit, resolution can be addressed expeditiously.
- "Business Arrangements and representations" are somewhat more nebulous and subjective. There may not be record of such arrangements within County files, which means the only way to collect this information would be to engage landowners, asking them to share any information they have. They are not obliged to share and therefore, any information we received would be on a volunteer basis. There is no guarantee that all would be shared nor is there any guarantee that this information could be shared publicly.
- To meet the requirements of the Act, the Development Authority, whether Council, MPC or Administration, permits Development based on regulated processes including Applications, Referrals and Permits.

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- As such, Administration is requesting Council to give further clarity with respect to Motion 305/17 specifically:
 - Define which files that need to be reported on ie: Legacy
 Development or Legacy Enforcement List (Attachment #1)
 - Should Administration reach out to the landowners on the list to request any information they have on record and acquire consent to share said information?
 - Provide clarity on what information is required from property files. These files can be quite extensive and generating copies of all correspondence will be costly and time consuming; and
 - Provide clarity on what is meant by "business arrangements entered into or represented".
- Consideration needs to be given to how this motion impacts direction from Council, given the Implementation Plan. How does Administration reconcile conflicting direction from Council?
- Acknowledgment that depending on the complexity and extent of information being requested, Council should provide Administration with adequate time to deliver.
- Acknowledgment that information collected may need to be shared incamera due to FOIP legislation.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

Goal 3.3.3 from Council's Strategic Plan:

"Enforcement procedures are established when a use or activity is in violation of Sturgeon County's Bylaws."

Municipal Development Plan - Bylaw 1313/13

Under Responsible Governance and Enacting Responsible Subdivision and Development Practices, policy 1.4.18 determines that the County: Shall adopt and apply enforcement procedures to clarify and establish (for both the impacted citizen and offender) a course of action when a use or activity is in violation of the County's Bylaws.

Section 4.2 of Land Use Bawl 1385/17

.1 Every person who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this Bylaw, or who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any of the provisions of this Bylaw, or fails to comply with any order, notice, or direction given under this Bylaw, commits an offence. Each calendar day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offence.

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- No person shall authorize or undertake any development that is .2 not consistent with the description, specifications or plans that were the basis for issuing a development permit under this Bylaw.
- No person shall contravene or fail to comply with a condition of a .3 development permit issued under this Bylaw or a Development Agreement entered pursuant to a development permit or a subdivision approval.
