Title | 2017 Linear Assessment Year Modifiers

Proposed Motion

Report

Background

Property assessments are adjusted yearly to reflect increases and decreases in market value, or as in the case of industrial and linear properties, changes in estimated costs to construct or build a specific property. It is a common principle that in times of economic downturn, when costs of construction and materials drops, the assessment reflects the trend by applying a reduced assessment year modifier (AYM). This occurred in 2015 and 2016 when we realized significant drops in the linear AYMs.

Understanding the fair and equitable assessment system, Sturgeon County sent a resolution to increase notification of AYM sooner in the year rather than after budgets have been passed.

Draft assessment year modifiers from Municipal Affairs are calculated by industry experts reviewing the changes in construction costs. Assessment Services uses the draft AYMs to predict current year linear assessments for budget approval. This year's modifiers were circulated in October. These draft AYMs revealed an increase in pipelines by approximately 10% and wells by approximately 18%.

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The 2017 Minister's Guidelines for Linear Property, Machinery and Equipment, Railway and Farm Land were approved on December 19, 2017 and did not include the recommended increases. The analyses provided by industry experts, paid under this ministry, were apparently disregarded.

The last update from Municipal Affairs Linear Branch revealed Fox Creek pipeline is operational and will be added to Sturgeon County's 2017 assessment roll. While Sturgeon County is fortunate to have a project completed and recognize a linear assessment increase, this is not the same for other municipalities. If the growth in assessment from the Fox Creek pipeline was not added, Sturgeon County would be in the same situation as other rural municipalities in Alberta with linear assessment considerably below what was estimated.
