Title

Request for First Reading Bylaw 1364/16 and 1365/16 – Road Closures for Range Road 221 and Township 560

Proposed Motion

- 1. That Council give first reading to Bylaw 1364/16, a bylaw that closes portions of Range Road 221.
- 2. That Council give first reading to Bylaw 1365/16, a bylaw that closes portions of Township Road 560.

Administrative Recommendation

That Council approves first reading of Bylaw 1364/16 and Bylaw 1365/16 to facilitate the road closures of portions of Range Road 221 and Township Road 560 for the Pembina Rail Expansion which is required to support the transportation of Northwest Redwater Partnership Sturgeon Refinery products.

Previous Council Direction

Report

Background Information

- ISL Engineering, on behalf of Pembina, submitted two (2) road closure applications on March 14, 2016. The purpose of the road closures is to accommodate rail for the Redwater South Rail Yard Expansion (RSRYE).
- At-grade crossings are not practical for the number of rail lines proposed, therefore the public road allowances are required to be closed. Alternate access has been provided by the construction of Range 220 by Pembina in 2015/2016.
- This rail expansion supports Northwest Refining by establishing a rail yard that will transport various products to market.
- This process will follow Alberta Transportation's procedure for road closures.
- Council must give first reading to the Bylaws and hold public hearings prior to submitting the signed, dated, original bylaw to the Minister of Transportation for approval.

External Communication

- Notifications of the road closures were sent to all third party interests for parcels adjacent to the proposed closures.
- Public Hearing notification will be sent to all landowners within one mile of the proposed road closures. The public hearings will be advertised in the local newspaper (The Redwater Review, and The Heartland Extra).

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Planned Growth and Prosperity – The proposed Road Closures are in alignment with Goal 2.1 of the Strategic Plan which states "Sturgeon County has a positive business environment that supports a strong economic foundation."

The proposed Road Closures are in alignment with Section 5.1.7 of the Municipal Development Plan which states the County "Should participate in strategic initiatives with local and regional stakeholders to capitalize on investment opportunities for key Non-Residential development."

Organizational:

Administration will coordinate the signing for first reading of the attached bylaws and refer to the Minister of Transportation for review and approval, following the Public Hearing. Second and Third Reading will proceed to Council after the Minister has signed the bylaw.

Financial:

As the road closures are required for the RSRYE. The County will collect industrial assessment in the future for this development.

The attached Road Closure Transfer Agreement outlines how the purchase of the road allowance will be completed. This agreement specifies an amount of \$20,000 per acre as the purchase price of the subject land. The \$20,000 per acre value was provided by Sturgeon County's Assessment Department.

Alternatives Considered

That Council not approve first reading for Bylaw 1364/16 and Bylaw 1365/16.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

- Planned Growth and Prosperity If the proposed road closure is not approved, Goal 2.1 of the Strategic Plan, which states "Sturgeon County has a positive business environment that supports a strong economic foundation" may not be adhered to.
- Grading work for RSRYE could not be completed if the road closures are not approved. This rail expansion supports Northwest Refining by establishing a rail yard that will transport various products to market.

Organizational:

• The Bylaws will not be referred to the Minster of Transportation as first reading is required prior to being able to do so.

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Financial:

 As the road closures are required for the RSRYE, there will be no future industrial assessment for this project.

- 1. Coordinate First Reading Signature
- 2. Advertise for Public Hearing
- 3. Schedule and conduct Public Hearing
- 4. Address third party feedback from notifications
- 5. Forward Bylaws to Alberta Transportation
- 6. Proceed with 2nd and 3rd reading
