# Request for Decision

Title	Development Permit 17-D0098 – Lafarge Canada Inc. – Quick Extraction Zones 1 & 3
Proposed Motion	That Council conditionally approve Development Permit 17-D0098.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council conditionally approve Development Permit 17-D0098 to allow Lafarge Canada Inc. to continue to mine and process aggregate in Zones 1 & 3, as per the proposed conditions of approval.
Previous Council Direction	May 9, 2017 – Motion 203/17: That Council give third reading to Bylaw 1387/17.
	September 24, 2013 – Motion 411/13: That County Council conditionally approves Lafarge Canada Inc. Development Permit 13-D0069 (proposed sand and gravel mining operation including secondary processing) Chapter III Extraction Zone 1 QEA.
Report	<ul> <li>Council approved Development Permit 13-D0069 for resource extraction and secondary processing for Zone 1 in September 2013. Permit 13-D0069, expired on November 27, 2016.</li> <li>In October 2016 (prior to the expiry date), Aspen Land Group, on behalf of Lafarge Canada Inc., applied to amend the Calahoo – Villeneuve Sand &amp; Gravel Area Structure Plan (CVASP) to increase the operational timelines for the Quick Extraction policy area, specifically for their Zone 1 from 4 years to 9 years.</li> <li>Council approved Bylaw 1387/17 to increase the operational timelines on May 9, 2017. Now that the timelines within the CVASP have been extended, Aspen Land Group, on behalf of Lafarge Canada Inc., has applied for a Development Permit to extend the operation.</li> </ul>
	As part of the Public Hearing for Bylaw 1387/17, several concerns were raised regarding the possibility of extending the road closure of Campsite Road. As per section 2.3 of Lafarge Canada Inc.'s Chapter IV

report, the road will be dealt with as per the Development Agreement

between Sturgeon County and Lafarge Canada Inc.

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- The operational hours are proposed to be extended from twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days a week (summer months only) to twenty-four (24) hours per day seven (7) days a week (year-round). The purpose of this change is to allow Lafarge Canada Inc. to take advantage of the milder falls and winters we have been experiencing, allowing them to mine and reclaim the areas in a shorter period.
- The report submitted by the Applicant states that in the future they may import inert material to the site to be used as fill. Since this activity is hypothetical and limited information is provided regarding this matter, Administration believes that if/when this activity is to take place in the future, it should be dealt with under a separate Development Permit at that time. Development Permit condition #7 reflects this.

### **External Communication**

- In April 2017, the application was circulated to internal departments and external agencies; no objections or concerns were noted. However, Engineering Services did provide the following comment:
  - The road closure of Campsite Road is to remain on schedule according to the report. As well, the Road Use Agreement, and dust control on the detour routes outlined in the agreement, will need to be followed until Campsite Road is re-opened.

## Implication of Administrative Recommendation

#### Strategic Alignment:

**Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership** – extending the operational period for this pit will allow Sturgeon County to collect more within the Community Aggregate Payment (CAP) Levy.

**Maintain and Enhance Strong Communities** – the CAP levies collected from this operation will be reinvested back into the the Calahoo – Villeneuve community.

#### Organizational:

There are no organizational implications.

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## Financial: This extension would increase the amount of money the County would receive under the CAP Levy. **Alternatives** That Council refuses Development Permit 17-D0098 Considered Implications of **Strategic Alignment: Alternatives** No strategic alignment. Organizational: Administration will have to find a way to work with the Applicant to reconstruct Campsite Road, without mining the remainder of the sand and gravel. Financial: The Sturgeon County community would lose CAP Levy contributions for the aggregate that would be sterilized unless future amendments are considered.
