Request for Decision

Title	General Municipal Servicing Standards Vision Statement and Guiding Principles
Proposed Motion	That Council approve the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles to provide Administration with direction required to complete the rewrite of Sturgeon County's General Municipal Servicing Standards.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council approve the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles to provide Administration with a pathway for completing a rewrite of Sturgeon County's General Municipal Servicing Standards.
Previous Council Direction	None.
Report	 The General Municipal Servicing Standards (GMSS) are intended to provide specific guidelines to assist Sturgeon County and Developers in the design, preparation and submission of plans and specifications for construction of municipal improvements and systems that will meet the servicing requirements for commercial, industrial and residential subdivision development (multi-lot and single lots) within Sturgeon County. Infrastructure assets included in the GMSS rewrite include: Water Distribution System; Sanitary Sewer System; Storm water Management System; Subdivision Roadways; and Landscaping. The current version of GMSS was created in 2009 and was intended to focus mainly on servicing for multi-lot subdivisions. The GMSS were last amended in December of 2012, though were not formally adopted. Engineering Services identified the GMSS update project as a Department initiative in 2016. Given that land development in Sturgeon County entails aspects from residential (Subdivision of 2.47 acres) to agriculture to industrial (World-class petrochemical projects), having clear and consistent servicing standards and requirements is critical. On January 17, 2017, during a briefing to Council, Administration presented an update on the GMSS project. During the discussion, it was clear that members of Council wanted an opportunity to provide feedback on issues

- and opportunities with the current GMSS, both based on their experience as Municipal Planning Commission and Subdivision and Development Authority Board members, along with feedback from residents.
- On April 18, 2017, Council held a facilitated workshop on the GMSS to discuss:
 - Role of GMSS in Sturgeon County;
 - Scope of Sturgeon County influence on municipal servicing standards; and
 - Sturgeon County's vision and guiding principles.
- The intent of the GMSS rewrite is to provide Administration with wellbalanced tools and solutions to meet the diverse needs of our residents and ratepayers by introducing servicing standards to support urban, rural, agricultural, commercial and industrial development.
- After the workshop, Administration took away the following:
 - 1. A greater understanding of the issues/concerns/opportunities Members of Council have of the current GMSS; and
 - 2. Opportunity to refine the Vision and Guiding Principles discussed with Council.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- The GMSS rewrite will reflect all Federal and Provincial Environmental legislation and other regulations including but not limited to the following:
 - Alberta Protection and Enhancement Act (EPEA) and Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP)
 - Transportation Association of Canada (TAC) and the Institute of Traffic Engineers (ITE).
- The GMSS will support Sturgeon County's Municipal Development Plan, Land Use Bylaw Re-write, as well as regulations stipulated within the Municipal Government Act (MGA).
- The GMSS will be congruent in supporting other initiatives currently underway such as the Sustainable Roads Infrastructure Strategy (SRIS), the Local Road Reconstruction Program, Sturgeon County Competitiveness Study and 4-Stage Capital Plan.
- The GMSS rewrite will be completed in accordance to present day standards and guidelines published under APEGA, utilizing current Engineering Best Practices, methodologies, and technology as well as implementing Best Management Practices using a practical, affordable approach to servicing land without sacrificing our long-term infrastructure investments, and essential servicing (i.e. Asset Management).
- The GMSS will be congruent and competitive with current industry standards being utilized in neighboring municipalities in the Capital Region.
- Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c.M-26, Section 654(1)(b) prohibits
 the approval of a subdivision application unless the proposed subdivision
 conforms with the provisions of any statutory plan.
- Sturgeon County Municipal Development Plan, Policy 1.4.9: (p. 31) Enacting Responsible Subdivision and Development Practices, "Shall ensure that both subdivision and development meet or exceed the standards outlined

- Many of our current policies and procedures are linked to the GMSS. As such, the project will need to ensure alignment with other Sturgeon County policies and procedures.

Financial:

The budget for the GMSS Update Project has been included in Engineering Services' 2016 and 2017 workplan.

Alternatives Considered

That Council not approve the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

 Not approving the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles may be inconsistent with the Municipal Development Plan Section 1.4.9 "Standards should be reviewed and updated along with other County regulatory policies to coincide with innovations in the industry," as well as Section 1.4.13 "Should establish general development design guidelines for Residential and non-Residential developments."

Organizational:

- Not approving the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles for re-writing Sturgeon County's General Municipal Servicing Standards would result in the County being non-compliant with current Federal and Provincial standards and guidelines.
- Not approving the Vision Statement and Guiding Principles will impede
 Administration's ability to successfully complete the GMSS rewrite project.
