Title	Debenture Bylaw 1393/17, Cardiff Inflow & Infiltration Utilities Project (First Reading)			
Proposed Motion	That Council give first reading to Debenture Bylaw 1393/17 Cardiff Inflow & Infiltration Utilities Project with a maximum amount of \$1,000,000.			
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council approve first reading of the Debenture Bylaw to fund this project as approved in the 2017 Capital Budget.			
Previous Council Direction	December 12, 2016 – Motion 455/16 That Council approve the 2017 Operating and Capital Budget as presented in the 2017 Budget Document.			
Report	<ul> <li>Cardiff sewer line Inflow &amp; Infiltration rehabilitation project will help reduce sewer inflow and infiltration; this reduction will help ensure that the County is in compliance with the Alberta Capital Region Wastewater Commission (ACRWC) service levels and peak flows.</li> <li>Administration will only draw on the debenture in the amount that is required to fund the project.</li> <li>The total outstanding debt principal as of December 31, 2016 was \$30,383,410 (audited).</li> <li>Sturgeon County's debt limit as of December 31, 2016 per the <i>Municipal Government Act</i> (MGA) is \$84,984,680.</li> <li>Sturgeon County's debt limit as of December 31, 2016 per Sturgeon County's Debt Policy (PLY_Debt_Management_Policy_2015) is \$67,987,744.</li> <li>Remaining debt limit available on Sturgeon County Policy is \$37,604,334; on MGA regulations, it is \$54,601,270.</li> <li>External Communication</li> <li>The Bylaw will be advertised in various media outlets, and posted on the Sturgeon County website.</li> <li>Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:</li> <li>Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000 c.M-26:</li> <li>Section 253 states that money obtained by a municipality under a</li> </ul>			

borrowing must be used for purpose for which it is borrowed.

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- Section 254 states that no municipality may acquire, remove or start
  construction or improvement of a capital property that is to be financed
  in whole or in part through a borrowing unless the borrowing bylaw that
  authorizes the borrowing is passed.
- Section 251 (3) states that a borrowing bylaw must be advertised.
- Section 231 (3) states that a petition against the bylaw is not sufficient unless it is filed with the CAO within 15 days after the last date on which the bylaw was advertised.

# Implication of Administrative Recommendation

## Strategic Alignment:

**Goal 1.2.1:** Short term and long term financial plans developed that ensure the provision of core services and infrastructure to residents.

## **Organizational:**

Cardiff Inflow and Infiltration Utilities Project was included in the 2017 Capital Budget.

## Financial:

Interest rates can fluctuate until a debenture is taken out; however, the current interest rates and implications are below. Cardiff Inflow and Infiltration Utilities Project was part of the approved 2017 Operating and Capital Budget under the Utilities Capital Budget, and were to be funded by debenture.

The current interest rate for a 15-year debenture is 2.653%. Payments would begin in 2018:

- 2. Finance to bring Debenture Bylaw 1393/17 back to council for second and third reading July 10, 2017.
