Request for Decision

Title	2017 Property Tax Write-off			
Proposed Motion	That Council authorize the write-off of taxes owing in the amount of \$72,537.12 per the presented tax roll list, as these accounts are no longer collectible.			
Administrative Recommendation	That Council ensures Sturgeon County Financial Statements reflect the actual amount of taxes expected to be collected.			
Previous Council Direction	None.			
Report	 Background Information The write-off of tax arrears in the amount of \$72,537.12 is related to: Three (3) Linear accounts; Six (6) Oilfield accounts; Two (2) Grant-in-Lieu of Taxes (Provincial Government). 			
	 Sturgeon County adjusts taxes receivable to allow for uncollectible accounts each year as part of the audit process to ensure receivables and revenues are not overstated. 			
	• Four of the oilfield accounts and one linear account all belong to one company. According to the receiver who handled the sale of the assets, there were no proceeds left to settle the tax arrears owing on these accounts. Also, the remainder of the company's salvageable assets that the receiver was charged with did not fall within Sturgeon County's jurisdiction. As such, the County was listed as an unsecured debtor. As per legal counsel, this account was deemed uncollectible.			
	• The remaining oilfield accounts and one other linear account also belonged to a single company. They are in the final stages of receivership. The proceeds of the sale of the assets of this company are only sufficient to cover the fees owing to the trustee in administering matters as per correspondence received from the receiver. Sturgeon County and other municipalities listed on the account will not be receiving tax arrears owed. As per legal counsel, this account is deemed uncollectible.			
	The final linear account on the list belongs to a company whose offices were attended to by civil enforcement. The company's name had been removed from the building's registry and the remaining assets in the

The cost of the removal of these remaining assets would outweigh the tax arrears owed on the account. The company's name has been subsequently removed from Alberta Registries according to the bailiff, leaving no further recourse to recover the taxes owed on the property.

- The two Grant-in-Lieu of Taxes accounts were formerly paid for by Alberta Municipal Affairs. One of the properties was formerly operated by Alberta Alcohol and Drug Abuse Commission (AADAC) and the property no longer qualifies under the grant in place of taxes (GIPOT) program for 2017. The second account is also no longer eligible under the GIPOT program. Alberta Transportation reported that the house on the property was demolished in 2013 and the lease on the property was also terminated in that same year. As such, the taxes on the property for the 2017 taxation will not be paid. Municipal Affairs did pay all taxes owed up until 2016.
- Sturgeon County wrote off taxes owing in the amount of \$63,975.37 in 2016.
- Oilfield and linear accounts also have until June 30th to settle taxes owed. If they remain unpaid, Sturgeon County engages the services of a bailiff. The bailiff makes considerable attempts to seize property owned by the company responsible for the tax accounts to recoup the taxes owed. If the said company is in receivership due to bankruptcy, Sturgeon County is listed as a creditor with the receiver to be eligible for payments from the proceeds of the sale of the company's assets. In some cases, the proceeds of the salvageable assets are not sufficient to pay the fees associated with receivership, which are first in line before other creditors.
