Report	Background Information
	<u>#1 Special Ballots</u> The <i>LAEA</i> legislates the option of providing voting by special ballot and Council's role in this decision.
	Given Sturgeon County's demographics have changed over the years due to a number of different factors such as changes in employment, certain electors are unable to attend a voting station on election day.
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As such, special ballots allow more eligible electors to cast their vote by removing barriers to do so. Although, in order for electors to request a Special Ballot, they will need to complete an application with the following information:

- First and last name of the elector;
- Municipal address of the residence of the elector;
- School elector status, if the elector is voting for a school board trustee;
- Mailing address to which the special ballot is to be sent;
- Contact telephone number;
- Contact e-mail address, if the elector is unavailable by telephone; and
- Reason why a special ballot is requested.

In the 2013 General Municipal Election, there were 23 electors who accessed this method of voting.

Upon review of the previous Special Ballot Bylaw, Administration noted that the bylaw did not establish a specific date and time prior to the closing of the voting station for the return of special ballots. As such, setting a time for the return of special ballots ensures that electors understand their responsibility; as well, it allows time for the Returning Officer to account for the ballots. Given this, Administration recommends implementing a deadline of 4:30 p.m. the day of the general municipal election as the cutoff for receiving special ballots.

Finally, Bylaw 1063/05 Municipal Election Vote By special ballot is no longer required and may be done by resolution as per the LAEA.

## #2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions

Sturgeon County will require approximately 65 election workers to conduct an effective and efficient election process. For the school boards to conduct their own elections it would involve each school board recruiting enough workers, arguably from the same pool of workers. This is impractical and inefficient.

As a result, each of the school boards have requested that Sturgeon County's Returning Officer conduct their respective elections. The school boards will compensate Sturgeon County on a proportional basis for providing election services. In each case, however, the school board is still required to appoint their own respective Returning Officer and conduct the School Trustee nomination process.

In past elections, school boards have seen several acclamations, resulting in no need for a full election. Therefore, there may not be elections in all wards, but until Nomination Day there is no certainty.

## #3 Ballots Printed in Lots

Printing ballots in lots allows the printer to rotate the names alphabetically of each candidate so that each candidate has an opportunity to be the first one listed on the ballot, rather than being in alphabetical order, which is

	seen by some to less likely influence voters who know less about the candidates. Based on this approach, Administration recommends Council consider printing ballots in lots.
	External Communication
	<u>#1 Special Ballots</u> Voting by special ballot will be communicated to the electors through the website, County Connections, news media, social media, and other methods as the election proceeds.
	<u>#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions</u> Ongoing communication with the respective school board Administration's as the agreements are developed and ratified. Following Nomination Day, the parties involved will prepare for those school wards that will be holding elections.
	<u>#3 Ballots Printed in Lots</u> Printing ballots in lots will be referenced in information for candidates.

	<u>#1 Special Ballots</u> By ensuring the electors are provided opportunities to cast their vote promotes fairness and equity.
	#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions By providing election services to the school boards demonstrates a strong collaborative approach.

# Organizational:

# <u>#1 Special Ballots</u> This is a proactive decision that will enable electors with another option on how they can vote. This decision can be accommodated within the current capacity of the election office.

	<u>#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions</u> A template school elections agreement has been developed for this scenario, including setting out the responsibilities of each party, thereby ensuring a smooth transition for the election.
	<u>#3 Ballots Printed in Lots</u> There is little impact organizationally; a print shop is used to print the ballots. Electors mark their ballots for one candidate; election workers are then counting only one mark, regardless of name order.
	<u>Financial:</u>
	#1 Special Ballots
	The financial impact is included in the election budget. Albert Municipal Affairs provides the necessary forms and instructions to electors on voting by special ballot. The only costs involved would be for copying and mailing the special ballot package.
	<u>#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions</u> The financial impact is mitigated by the schools contributing proportional costs. Costs will be outlined in the agreements but cannot be finalized until it is determined how many school wards will be holding elections which will be identified after Nomination Day.
	#3 Ballots Printed in Lots
	Slight cost increase in the setup of the printing of ballots in lots, as
	compared to printed in alphabetical order.
Alternatives	#1 Special Ballots
Considered	To not offer special ballots was rejected as it was anticipated that Sturgeon County Council wants to provide flexibility and to encourage electors to vote by providing them with this alternative method of voting.
	<u>#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions</u> Sturgeon County could choose not to enter into agreements with the school boards. Sturgeon County Council values collaboration and this is enhanced by entering into these agreements.
	<u>#3 Ballots Printed in Lots</u> The alternative to print the ballots alphabetically as per section 43(2) of the LAEA.

Alternatives	<u>#1 Special Ballots,</u> To not offer the option of special ballots does not demonstrate Sturgeon County values.
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	#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions
	To not provide election services for the school boards does not exhibit
	collaboration, which is inconsistent with the values and goals of the Count
	<u>#3 Ballots Printed in Lots</u>
	There is no implication.
	Organizational:
	There are no vast organizational implications of any of the proposed
	recommendations set out within the Request for Decision.
	<u>Financial:</u>
	#2 Election Services Agreements with School Jurisdictions
	When performing the school elections, there is shared cost on rental of
	facilities, election workers and materials. This benefits the County in the
	overall cost of conducting an election. If the County does not enter into
	agreements, then the entire cost of the election will solely be the
	responsibility of the County.
	<u>#3 Ballots Printed in Lots</u>
	There is a slight cost saving if the ballots were printing alphabetically rathe
	than in lots.

	1. Communicate to Deputy Returning Officer and staff the special ball
	process (June 2017).
