Our History

- Local Member Owned Utility
- Initially formed to bring rural power to farms
- Promotes social and economic advantages
- Stimulates rural based employment and support to local economy
- NPP formed through amalgamation of four smaller REA's in 2000



Our Structure

What we look like

- Own and maintain power poles and lines in operating area
 - Morinville to Lac La Biche
 - ~2,200 miles of line and over 40,000 power poles
- Self-operating REA
 - Board of Directors (8)
 - Staff members (13)
- Wholly owned and partially owned subsidiaries
 - Northern Lights Energy & Power
 - Alberta Cooperative Energy (ACE)
