Title	Municipal Internship Program Application - Finance Officer			
Proposed Motion	That Council approve the application to host a Finance Officer Intern through the Provincial Municipal Internship Program.			
Administrative Recommendation	That Sturgeon County put forward an application to host a Finance Officer Intern through the government grant program which takes advantage of funding for a full-time resource at a subsidized cost.

Report	Background Information			
	 The hiring of a Municipal Finance Intern through the Provincial Municipal Internship Program is being brought forward as part of the 2019 budget process. 			
	• Since the application to host a Municipal Finance Intern is due September 11, 2018, and the proposal has a budget impact for 2019; Administration is requesting approval to submit the application.			
	 Host municipalities receive a grant of \$43,000 in the first year and \$23,000 in the second year (if extended) to assist with the costs of hosting an Intern. 			
	• Sturgeon County's approximate annual cost, net of the grant, would be \$22,000 for year one and \$40,500 year two, funded through the general			

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operating reserve with no impact to taxation if approved. If approved, the grant would significantly subsidize the County's contribution for an additional full-time resource.

- This is a one-year program with the option of a second-year extension.
- To qualify, host municipalities will provide comprehensive experience in the financial services area of the municipality and provide a sufficient commitment of resources, both financial and staff.
- The current Finance Intern's term ends with the County early 2019, and Sturgeon County must reapply for a new intern to remain in the program.
- Administration sees this position as an opportunity to continue with the success the Finance department has had developing key policies and procedures without committing Sturgeon County to long-term budget increases.
- The intern also provides operational and technical support to the Finance department and organization.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership – Approval of the funding for the Finance Intern position would consider fiscal stability and sustainability.

Organizational:

This recommendation would enable the Finance department to maintain their current service levels within the department.

Financial:

If approved, the County would have an estimated annual cost, net of the grant, of \$22,000 for year one and \$40,500 for year two (if extended) which would be funded through the general operating reserve with no impact to taxation.

Alternatives Considered

1. Do not apply for the Finance Officer Intern government grant.

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Implications of **Alternatives**

Strategic Alignment:

Not proceeding with the application could result in the inability to meet service level requests in an efficient and cost-effective manner.

Organizational:

Financial Services has actively participated in the program for some time now. Not applying for this opportunity would increase existing Finance team members' workload and potentially decrease service levels or the ability to perform ad hoc project work within the Finance department.

Financial:

Grant funding not received would amount to \$43,000 for year one and \$23,000.

Follow up Action

1. The grant application is due September 1, 2018. Administration would submit prior to this date should Council approve the motion.
