Request for Decision

Title | Cardiff Road Improvements Project – Contract Award Recommendation **Proposed Motion** 1. That Council approve the increased budget and funding for the Cardiff Main Road Improvements project in the amount of \$234,000, funded by the Federal Gas Tax Fund grant. 2. That Council approve the increased budget and funding for the Cardiff Main Road Improvements project in the amount of \$349,289, funded by the Transportation Capital Road Network Reserve. 3. That Council award the contract for construction of the Cardiff Main Road Improvements project to Carmacks Enterprises Ltd., at a contract price of \$2,714,290.00 (not including GST). **Administrative** Administration recommends that Council increase the budget for this Recommendation project and award the contract for the construction of the Cardiff Road Improvements Project to Carmacks Enterprises Ltd., at a contract price of \$2,714,290 (not including GST) with an anticipated overall project budget estimated to be \$3,236,947, and proceed with the project. **Previous Council** 12/13/2016 - Motion 455/16: Direction That Council approve the 2017 Operating and Capital Budget as presented in the 2017 Budget Document. 06/28/2016 – Motion 239/16: That Council approve the projects in Stage 4 - Construction above the red line for the 2017 construction season. Report **Background Information** 2013 Open House Feedback During the first open house, residents identified speeding, volume of traffic/percentage of truck traffic and lack of sidewalks as some of their primary concerns. Vehicles backing onto Cardiff Road, lack of shoulders and the need to pave Cardiff road were identified as secondary concerns. Residents strongly supported the urbanization of Cardiff Road to address these concerns.

Cardiff Road Corridor – Scope of Work

- Shoulder widening, rehabilitation of Cardiff Road from Range Road 252 to Discovery Ave.
- Reconstruction and surfacing, curb and gutter (with ditch drainage outlets), traffic calming measures (curb extensions), new concrete accesses, new culverts (where required) along Cardiff Road from Discovery Ave to Range Road 251.
- 3.0 metre wide asphalt Shared Use Path from Discovery Ave to Cardiff Park Entrance.
- Reconstruction of Cardiff Reservoir Truck Fill Loop Road.

External Communication

- Two (2) open houses were held in 2013 which were advertised through a mailout, road sign and newspaper advertisement.
- Construction information session advertised via mailout and road sign to be held on May 16, 2017, were subject to Council approval/ award.
- Notices were sent to landowners adjacent to Sturgeon County-owned utility right-of-way where tree-clearing activities would be taking place.
- Cardiff Road Improvements Project was tendered through the Alberta Purchasing Connection on April 18, 2017. Tenders closed on May 5, 2017 at 2:00 p.m.
- We received nine (9) bids ranging from \$2,714,290.00 to \$3,753,431.20 excluding GST.
- The engineering consultant, ISL Engineering and Land Services, reviewed the tenders and recommends Sturgeon County award the contract for the Cardiff Road Improvements Project to Carmacks Enterprises Ltd.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

 Procurement Procedure prd_pro_exe_2014 states that the lowest bid meeting the tender or request for proposal requirements and/or specifications will normally be accepted. Carmacks Enterprises Ltd. was the lowest compliant bidder for this project.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

<u>Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership</u> – The awarding of this contract would be consistent with Sturgeon County's procurement policy and support the Sturgeon County 4 Stage Capital Plan.

<u>Community Identity & Spirit</u> – Awarding this contract will promote Sturgeon County with residents due to the nature of the work associated with this project.

<u>Planned Growth</u> – This project considers cumulative costs and long term funding implications associated with the management of this infrastructure asset.

<u>Maintain and Enhance Strong Communities</u> – The rehabilitation of the Cardiff Road corridor will demonstrate a commitment to the community that Sturgeon County is committed to maintaining and updating existing infrastructure.

ISL will also be responsible for providing contract administration, quality assurance and materials testing services for the project.
