	<ul> <li>Given both the Federal and Provincial Government's intent to move forward with various legislation and practices pertaining to climate change, the AAMDC Board of Directors is looking to establish a Climate Change Advisory Committee.</li> <li>The Committee will advise the Board of rural Albertan perspectives in order to inform Board advocacy efforts regarding federal and provincial legislation and policies related to climate change.</li> <li>The Committee will be comprised of one (1) representative from each AAMDC District, and will be Chaired by an AAMDC Board member. Sturgeon County is a member of the Pembina River District.</li> <li>Given the level and scope of current and planned industrial activity within Sturgeon County, Administration believes Council would find value in participating on this Committee.</li> <li>Should Council recommend a member of Council be considered for the posting and that member be successfully appointed by the AAMDC, the</li> </ul>				

	<ul> <li>Given that the term is one calendar year, and that the Committee is likely to meet every two months, an estimated cost of \$1,080 can be absorbed through Council's approved 2017 budget.</li> <li>The application deadline is January 13, 2017.</li> </ul>

Administrative Recommendation	<b>Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership</b> – Active participation of this AAMDC Committee will provide Council with the opportunity to provide a Sturgeon County perspective on climate change issues, while collaboration with AAMDC, provincial and federal partners.
	<b>Respect the Natural Environment</b> – Council's Strategic Plan indicates that the County will comply with Federal and Provincial environmental legislation. This Committee is an opportunity to provide input into current and future environmental legislation that impacts rural municipalities, as it pertains to climate change.
	Organizational:
	Some minor staff time may be required to coordinate the submission process and to provide the appointed member of Council with briefing not and advice regarding Committee agenda topics.
	<u>Financial:</u>
	Sturgeon County Council Remuneration and Expense Policy (ADM-REM-1) provides a per diem of \$180 per day for Council approved activities.
	If there are six meetings held over the next calendar year (the Terms of Reference mentions meeting once every two months, or as needed), this could potentially represent a cost of \$1,080, plus 20% contingency would represent an approved maximum of \$1,300.
	A Service Enhancement of \$10,000 was approved as part of the 2017 Budg specifically for FCM/AAMDC Committee participation.
Alternatives Considered	Council may choose to forego authorizing a per diem for this Committee.
