Report	Background Information			

Summerbrook Subdivision

- Total length of rehabilitation is 3.4 km.
- The existing surface was paved in 1990.
- Pacer Ranking is 2.5 (Pacer is 1 10 2 is "very poor" and 3 "poor")
- Average width of the road is 9.0 metres.
- Road surface displays Alligator and Longitudinal cracking throughout the subdivision, as well as a number of settled areas and potholes.
- Drainage issues exist at the intersection of Coalmine Road and Estate
 Way; water is pooling near gutters and in the center of the road.
- Sturgeon County's Procurement Process guides that the lowest bid meeting the tender or request for proposal requirements and/or specifications will normally be accepted. Justification in writing along with recommendation must be submitted if the lowest bidder is not selected. Normally, the only reasons acceptable for selecting any but the lowest bidder would be:
 - Low bidder does not meet the specifications.
 - o Low bidder cannot deliver within the required time.

- The quality of performance of previous contracts or services may be in question.
- The acceptance of low bid would result in higher overall end costs (such as operating or life cycle costs).
- The ability, capacity, experience and efficiency of the bidder.
- Once the tenders or requests for proposals have been selected, all necessary contractual agreements, conditions, terms, documents, etc. will be completed and the tender or contract will be awarded.
- The opening of tenders or requests for proposals must be done in public tender meetings; tenders of \$500,000 in value or exceeding \$500,000 in aggregate value must be ratified at the following Council meeting.

External Communication

- Summerbrook Subdivision was tendered through the Alberta Purchasing Connection on March 7, 2017. Tenders closed on March 24, 2017 at 11:00 AM.
- We received thirteen (13) bids ranging from \$844,169.00 to \$1,246,293.00 (excluding GST).
- WSP Canada, engineering consultant, reviewed tenders and recommends Sturgeon County award the contract for Summerbrook Subdivision to Park-Aid Asphalt and Maintenance Ltd.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:
