Report	Background Information				
	• The Municipal Government Act (MGA) was amended by three bills over three years: Municipal Government Amendment Act 2015, Modernized Municipal Government Act (2016) and An Act to Strengthen Municipal Government (2017).				
	<ul> <li>Sturgeon County's submission on Round Two proposed changes included: Sturgeon County is pleased to see a slight increase to the maximum levy rate, and that municipalities will be the entity that continues to collect the levy. The revised rate gives greater flexibility for Councils, more closely aligned with inflation rates since the levy rate was last updated. Council would support the addition that clear public reporting should be mandatory on how CAP Levy funds are allocated, as to ensure transparency and to showcase industry's contributions to community.</li> </ul>				
	Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee submission on the proposed changes included:				
	<ul> <li>It should be mandatory for municipalities to invest CAP Levy funds in affected areas where aggregate operations occur,</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>We support the mandatory provincial collection of CAP levy on all aggregate extraction regardless of the nature of the project - no exceptions including public infrastructure projects,</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>We support the mandatory provincial collection of CAP levy by all municipalities and all producers,</li> </ul>

- We support the increase in levy subject to the uniform collection, transparency in reporting and emphasis on benefit to the affected community, and
- The Committee supports the inclusion of an orphan pit fund as part of the CAP levy.
- Most of the changes contained in three MGA Review amending bills and their associated regulations came into force on October 26, 2017, including the Community Aggregate Payment Levy Regulation.
- This regulation enables municipalities to voluntarily pass Community Aggregate Payment Levy (CAPL) bylaws to impose a levy on shipments of sand and gravel (aggregate) operations in a municipality. This regulation is relevant only in municipalities where aggregate operations take place and enables municipalities to adopt a bylaw to collect a levy to offset the impacts of aggregate operations, such as those associated with road infrastructure, or towards other community benefit projects, as determined by municipal councils.
- The maximum levy rate is increased from \$0.25 to \$0.40 per tonne of shipped sand and gravel, keeping the rate in line with inflation and helping municipalities maintain the safety of roads and bridges impacted by heavy industry. The expiry date was extended by five years to December 31, 2022.
- Sturgeon County's current bylaw set the uniform levy rate at \$0.25 per tonne in 2006 and it has not been reviewed or amended.
- In support of continuous improvement, ensuring compliance with our policy and procedure framework and best practice, Administration is recommending a repeal and replacement of the bylaw versus an amendment.

### **External Communication**

- Brief consultation with the Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee occurred during the draft for first reading.
- The draft Bylaw was reviewed by Legal Counsel and specific advice was received regarding the offences.
- Additional consultation will take place after Council has passed first reading and the Bylaw becomes public and open for debate.

### Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000 c.M-26 Section 409.1 authorizes the passing of a bylaw to regulate the collection of a levy.
- Alberta Regulation 263/2005 Section 3(1) identifies the provisions of a bylaw and section 5(2) identifies the maximum levy rate.
