Title | Vegetation Management Standards Policy Amendment 1. That Council approve the proposed amendments to the Vegetation **Proposed Motion** Management Standards Policy as presented. 2. That Council approve the transfer of \$44,000 from the Agriculture Services Operating Reserve to the Agriculture Services Operating Budget to fund the service level increases resulting from changes to the Vegetation Management Standards Policy for 2017. Administrative That Council approves the above-listed motions as presented. Recommendation **Previous Council** February 14, 2016 – Committee of the Whole Presentation made to Council Direction regarding policy change options that could enhance current service levels. December 13,2016 – Motion 468/16: That Council direct Administration to bring forward a recommendation or policy amendment, defining levels of service for area Type 2 vegetation management, to include trimming around road signs and obstacles on road rights-of-way, and provide information regarding fiscal impact. May 10,2016- Motion 170/16: That Council approve the Vegetation Management Standards Policy as presented. Report **Background Information** The current Vegetation Management Standards Policy was approved by Council on May 10, 2016. This policy outlines Vegetation Management Standards (service levels) for all County-owned reserve lands and roadsides. During the 2017 Budget Process, concerns regarding vegetation management adjacent to Sturgeon County entrance signs and obstacles along high-traffic, paved roadways were brought forward. Upon further discussion, Council discussed the need to review and amend the current policy before committing additional resources to enhance current service levels. \$44,000 was allocated to an operating

reserve, should Council elect to amend the policy to increase service

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levels for 2017.

- Based on Council discussions, two main areas of concern have been identified as:
 - 1) The lack of weed trimming around obstacles along high traffic county roadways.
 - 2) The lack of weed trimming around Sturgeon County entrance signs.
- During Committee of the Whole on February 14, 2017, Administration
 presented multiple options to Council on policy amendments that could
 address the above-listed concerns. Council's response was to bring
 forward a combination of 'Option 2' and 'Option 3' for their
 consideration and deliberation.
- 'Option 2' includes the creation of a new category for Paved County Roadsides. The service levels for these areas would include mowing and trimming around signs and man-made obstacles a minimum two (2) times per growing season.
- 'Option 3' does not involve a policy amendment, as the current policy allows for Sturgeon County to perform vegetation management on lands which are not owned by Sturgeon County, provided "there is public benefit in doing so." Sturgeon County would obtain a permit from Alberta Transportation which would allow the County to perform weed control and trimming around Sturgeon County entrance signs within Provincial Highway road allowances.
- The estimated cost for implementing the two options is \$44,000. This includes labour, equipment and materials costs.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

Sturgeon County Vegetation Management Standards Policy (2016) Alberta Weed Control Act, SA 2008,c.W-5.1 and Regulations

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

This recommendation is consistent with multiple goals under each focus area of the Sturgeon County Strategic Plan, in particular *Operational Excellence* – executing consistently against a defined level of service.

Organizational:

Approval of amendments to the Vegetation Management Standards Policy will provide formal and clear direction to Administration regarding the service levels that Council wishes to provide to the residents of Sturgeon County.

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February 15, 2017 February 28, 2017 The Agriculture Services Department has the ability and capacity to ensure that the proposed service level enhancements resulting from the proposed policy amendments are successfully delivered.

Financial:

The cost of implementing the Policy amendments as described above is approximately \$44,000. This includes all costs including manpower, vehicles, equipment and materials.

The funding for these service level increases will be sourced from Operating Reserve. \$44,000 was transferred to reserves during the 2017 budget process for this designated use.

Alternatives Considered

- 1. No amendments to the current policy.
- 2. Amendment of the policy to include weed trimming around man-made obstacles for <u>all</u> Type 2 Areas at a frequency of two times per year minimum. Additionally, Sturgeon County would obtain permission (via permit) from Alberta Transportation to perform trimming around County Entrance signs on Provincial Highways.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

Both alternatives considered align with many of Sturgeon County's Strategic Focus areas.

Alternative 1 may result in lower resident satisfaction in the services provided by Sturgeon County.

Alternative 2 may result in increased service levels in areas where there may be limited benefit or value to the residents of Sturgeon County.

Organizational:

Administration has the ability to deliver the service levels that would result from both alternatives listed.

Review and amendment of Council Policies ensures that administration receives clear direction on Council's priorities.

Financial:

Alternative 1: No cost implications

Alternative 2: Approximately \$54,000, including manpower, vehicles, equipment and materials. Council would need to approve an extra \$10,000 in funding, in addition to the funds that were transferred to Operating Reserve for this use.

Follow up Action

- 1. Update Policy Manual (Legislative Services, March 2017)
- 2. Update County website to reflect amended standards (Agriculture Services, March 2017)
- 3. Adjust area classification inventory and service level reporting documents to reflect new 'Paved Road' category (Agriculture Services, March 2017)
