	 Correction of Alberta Agriculture and Rural Development to read Alberta Agriculture and Forestry, to ensure consistency with the Provincial Government's change in the name of the Ministry. Replacement of the 'Farmstead and Acreage Beautification Award with the 'Excellence in Agriculture Award' as a responsibility of the board, to reflect the new award category that has been developed and endorsed by the board.
