Title	Rural Extension and Environmental Conservation Program Resource Adjustments			
Proposed Motion	That Council approve the addition of 0.62 FTE in staff resources to support Rural Extension and Environmental Conservation Programs, to be funded at no additional cost through the reallocation of existing operating budget and Provincial ASB Grant dollars.			
Administrative Recommendation	That Council approve the motion as proposed.			
Previous Council Direction	None.			
Report	 Background Information Residents frequently access the Rural Extension and Environmental Conservation Programs offered by Sturgeon County. Through these programs, a variety of extension events including workshops, demonstrations and tours are offered to residents. The Sturgeon County Tree Program promotes the establishment of shelterbelts and trees by offering technical support and incentives to participating landowners. Additionally, support is available to producers interested in completing Environmental Farm Plans, which enables them to access financial incentive programs such as Growing Forward. The focus of this programming has evolved to address the needs of both the residential population and the agricultural community to ensure that relevant programming is available to all Sturgeon County residents. 			
	• Prior to 2011, Sturgeon County had 2.0 FTEs dedicated to supporting the Rural Extension and Environmental Programs of Sturgeon County and 6 partnering municipalities. These positions were funded by both municipal funds and by a grant received from AESA (Alberta Environmentally Sustainable Agriculture).			
	• In 2011, the Government of Alberta restructured the AESA program and combined it with the provincial Agricultural Service Board (ASB) Grant as an additional Program called the 'Environmental Stream' Grant. From 2011- 2016, Sturgeon County has jointly participated in this grant program with the Counties of Westlock, Athabasca and Barrhead. This			

grant has been used to fund joint staff resources, who facilitate extension and environmental programs within the four partnering municipalities and serve as a technical resource on environmental matters. Employees hired by this partnership have been managed and housed in both Westlock County and County of Barrhead.

- Sturgeon County contributes \$16,500 in municipal dollars annually to this partnership. Sturgeon County's portion of the ASB-Environmental Stream Grant is approximately \$21,750 annually, which is remitted directly to the partnership from the Government of Alberta, bringing Sturgeon County's total contributions up to \$38,250. Sturgeon County's municipal contributions have accounted for approximately 55% of the total cash contributions.
- A review of the cost-benefits of this arrangement has determined that Sturgeon County could significantly benefit from internalizing these program resources. For no additional cost, Sturgeon County could have its own internal staff resources to deliver its Rural Extension and Environmental Conservation Programs. This would ensure sufficient focus and continuous improvement on Sturgeon County's program development and delivery. It would also ensure that a technical resource is readily available to Sturgeon County residents.
- To ensure that Sturgeon County's unique programming requirements are met and the most value is achieved from Sturgeon County's municipal and grant funds, an individual Grant Application was submitted for the 2017-2019 cycle. Sturgeon County is guaranteed to receive a minimum of \$15,000 in Basic Environmental Stream Grant Funding and could receive as much as \$49,000 to fund its Rural Extension and Environmental Conservation Programs. The proposed 0.62 FTE increase will be completely 'self-funded', provided the current amount of grant funding (\$21,750) is maintained. Final approval confirmation is expected to be received in March.
- Updates on the status of these programs have been provided regularly to the Agricultural Service Board. At the February 8, 0217 Agricultural Service Board Meeting, Motion 022/17 was carried unanimously:

That the Agricultural Service Board recommends that County Council approve the resource restructuring proposed by Agriculture Services to ensure that Sturgeon County's Environmental and Extension Programs are adequately resourced and that maximum value is achieved for Sturgeon County residents and producers.

• The request for this FTE approval is brought to council prior to confirmation of the final grant amount to ensure continuity in service delivery in 2017 with the departure of key department staff. The recruitment and training of any new team members will be most successful (and have the lowest impact to service delivery) if completed prior to March 30, 2017.

Additionally, that portion of the ASB grant funding is only to be used specifically for Extension and Environmental Programming.
