Proposed Motion	 That Council ratify the Calahoo-Villeneuve Gravel Extraction Committee motion to award the 2017 Community Enhancement grants in the amount of \$137,942.49 to the community groups identified in the committee minutes of March 27, 2017. That Council ratify the Community Services Advisory Board motion to award the 2017 Community Association Grant dollars in the amount of \$152,465.65 to the community groups identified in the committee minutes of March 13, 2017. That Council approve an additional award in the amount of \$33,250 from the Sturgeon Industrial Community Fund Reserve to fund the grant requests for two high priority projects: Alcomdale Playground and Sturgeon Agriplex Kitchen.

Report	Background Information				
	 The Committees went through a process in awarding the grant dollars that was truly reflective of our key principles of volunteerism and strategic funding. There was debate over community priorities and greatest impact to residents. These decisions were not easy. The application deadline was February 17, 2017. 32 Community Organizations submitted applications. Total requests under the grant program equaled \$442,810.65 and the funding available was \$290,408.14. Priority groups for this year were those operating facilities in Sturgeon County and priority funding was in support of the growing costs of operating these facilities. Non-recognized groups who did apply did not receive funding. 96% of the operating requests were funding to a level of

	0	During 2014 and 2015 operating budget deliberations two
		consecutive operating service enhancements were approved
		(OP11 in 2014 & OP05 in 2015) for \$100,000 in each year to
		provide more sufficient funding and equal access to grant funds
		for community associations across the jurisdiction.
	0	In 2016 and again in 2017 we made a conscious decision to
		respond to need versus arbitrarily increase the budget amount
		and deplete the reserve.
	0	The additional \$33,250 will ensure that the two highest priority
		projects can be funded to amount requested in support of the
		volunteer efforts. Total capital requests were \$125,469.84 with
		\$63,851 available. If funding was granted exclusively to
		Alcomdale and Sturgeon Agriplex there would be no funding for
		any other organizations. Based on the merit of the applications
		received the Board is recommending total contribution to capital
		projects in the amount of \$97,101.
