Title	Sturgeon County <i>Modernized Municipal Government Act</i> Regulations Submission (Round 2)
Proposed Motion	That Council approve the recommended <i>Modernized Municipal Government Act</i> Regulations submission, and authorize the Mayor to submit it to the Minister of Municipal Affairs on behalf of Sturgeon County Council.

Report	 Background Information Over the last three (3) years, the Government of Alberta has undertaken a complete review of the <i>Municipal Government Act</i> (MGA), Alberta's enabling legislation for municipalities.
	 To-date, Sturgeon County Council has been actively engaged throughout the review process, and has submitted formal and informal feedback in multiple regards:

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- o Bill 20: Municipal Government Act, 2015
- o Bill 21: Modernized Municipal Government Act, 2016
- o Bill 8: An Act to Strengthen Municipal Government, 2017
- MGA Regulations Round 1, March 2017
- The MGA Regulations are intended to support the implementation of the legislative changes passed in Bills 8, 20, and 21 over the last two and a half years.
- Round 2 Regulations were presented for public feedback on July 24, 2017 and will remain open until September 22, 2017. No date(s) has been set for when the overall legislation and corresponding Regulations will be proclaimed. It is understood there will be at least one more round of Regulations that is released for public feedback (likely before 2018) which will include Regulations for Growth Management Boards, Annexation Principles, Voluntary Amalgamations, Inclusionary Housing, and more.
- In analyzing the Round 2 Regulations, Administration recommends that Council support most of the Regulations, while seeking clarifications on specific sections to provide further clarity.
- Specific draft Regulations that Council, through its deliberations, have taken a keen interest in include:
 - Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICFs)
 - o Code of Conduct for Elected Officials
 - o Council and Council Committee Meetings
 - Off-Site Levies
 - Community Aggregate Payment Levy
 - Matters Relating to Assessment Sub-Classes
 - o Matters Relating to Assessment and Taxation
- Attachment 1 summarizes the Round 2 Regulations, and provides a recommended Council response, for Council's review and approval.
