Request for Decision

Title	Appointment of Weed and Agricultural Pest Inspectors
Proposed Motion	That Council appoint Cathryn Thompson, Josh Pigeon, Marlise Kostiw and Tanysha Van Hecke as municipal inspectors under the Alberta <i>Agricultural Pests Act</i> and the Alberta <i>Weed Control Act</i> .
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council approves the proposed motion. In doing so, the municipality would adhere to provincial requirements set out in the Alberta <i>Agricultural Pests Act</i> and the Alberta <i>Weed Control Act</i> .
Previous Council Direction	April 25, 2017 – Motion 172/17: That Council appoint Cathryn Thompson, Kennedy Deregt-Taschuk, Josh Pigeon and Marlise Kostiw as Municipal Inspectors under the Alberta <i>Agricultural Pests Act</i> and the Alberta <i>Weed Control Act</i> .
Report	 Weed and pest inspectors are responsible for monitoring compliance and enforcing the Weed Control Act, Agricultural Pests Act and Sturgeon County's Grass Cuttings Bylaw, Bylaw 617/88. Municipalities are responsible for ensuring that sufficient inspectors are appointed. Sturgeon County receives Agricultural Service Board Grant funds from the province to contribute to eligible Agricultural Service Board Programs, including the costs associated with employing weed and pest inspectors. Failure to appoint sufficient municipal inspectors may result in appointment of inspectors by the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry. All expenses incurred when the Minister appoints inspectors are recovered from the municipality.
	 External Communication All job advertisements for inspectors are posted on the Sturgeon County website, university/college job boards, and provided through other various outlets. Information on our Vegetation Management and Pest Control

programs are available on the Sturgeon County website.

A "Weed of the Week" campaign is advertised each year from May to August on common weed species found within the region along with inspector contact information.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- Under Section 10(1) of the Agricultural Pests Act, a municipality shall appoint sufficient number of inspectors to carry out the Act and the regulations.
- Under Section 7(1) of the Weed Control Act, a municipality shall appoint a sufficient number of inspectors to enforce and monitor compliance within the municipality.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

This recommendation is consistent with multiple goals under each Focus area of the Sturgeon County Strategic Plan.

Organizational:

Vegetation Management and Pest Control are programs that are facilitated for county residents. Proactive and reactive Weed and Pest Inspections are key service levels within these programs.

Financial:

The hiring of these inspectors has been included in the 2018 budget. No additional resources are required.

Alternatives Considered

That County Council refrains from appointing the number of inspectors required to adequately administer the Weed Control Act and Agricultural Pests Act.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment:

This recommendation is not consistent with the Sturgeon County Strategic Plan Focus Areas, specifically Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership.

Organizational:

If a municipality fails to appoint sufficient municipal inspectors, the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry may designate inspectors to carry out these Acts within the municipality.

Financial:

Should the Minister appoint inspectors, all expenses incurred shall be recovered from the municipality.

Follow up Action 1. Issuance of Inspector Identification, as per the *Weed Control Act* and Agricultural Pests Act (Agriculture Services, May 2018).
