The last revisions to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Bylaw were made in lune of 2015 (Bylaw 1343/15) and February of 2016 (Bylaw 1361/16).         To comply with changes made to the Municipal Government Act that came into effect on January 1 and April 1, 2018, Sturgeon County must revise Subdivision and Development Appeal Bylaw 1361/16).
