Report	Background Information
	• During budget deliberations on November 28, 29 and 30, 2018, Council reviewed the Proposed 2019 Operating and Capital Budget including Service Enhancements, Budget Information Requests, and other initiatives brought forward by Council.
	• Administration put forth a proposed budget that is conservative in nature, both in terms of financial impact and magnitude of work load.
	• Administration worked to ensure that alternate funding sources were exhausted. Various provincial or federal grants are alternate funding sources that are always examined for feasibility and applicability.
	 Council's recommended 2019 Proposed Operating Budget is \$76,499,255, including \$55,762,080 Operating and \$21,224,800 Capital, not including significant tax revenue growth.
	 Revenue from significant growth is estimated to be approximately \$27.5 million for the 2019 budget which has been earmarked for priorities 1 through 8 per the Significant Tax Revenue Growth Policy.
