# **Request for Decision**

Title	Highway 825 Widening, Memorandum of Agreement
Proposed Motion	That Council authorize the County Commissioner to sign the Memorandum of Agreement between Alberta Transportation and Sturgeon County for the widening of Highway 825, to be funded by Offsite Levy Recovery Reserve.
Administrative Recommendation	That Council authorize the signing of the Memorandum of Agreement between Alberta Transportation and Sturgeon County for the widening of Highway 825 Capital Project.
Previous Council Direction	May 10, 2016 – Motion 177/16 That Council give third reading of Bylaw 1363/16 Amendment to Sturgeon Industrial Park Area Off-Site Levy Bylaw 1320/14.
Report	<ul> <li>Alberta Transportation is preparing to tender the widening of Highway 825 from Range Road 225 to Township Road 553 for construction in 2019 / 2020 construction seasons.</li> <li>Sturgeon County administration has been working in conjunction with Alberta Transportation since July 2016 on the design of Highway 825 widening. There are multiple projects within this scope of work, and all of these are identified within the Sturgeon Industrial Park Offsite Levy Bylaw.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Highway 825 widening and the creation of service roads to consolidate accesses required additional road allowance to be purchased by Alberta Transportation. Administration coordinated the sale of this land with the landowners involved.         <ul> <li>Administration entered into a front-ending agreement that committed developers to fund the design costs in 2016 to ensure suitable access to future development lands is included within the Alberta Transportation design and tender documents.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	o The front-ending agreement outlines that the developer's contribution for this design will be credited in the future as a Transportation Offsite Levy Credit for the parcel when a Development Agreement is completed. This front ending is tracked within the Sturgeon Industrial Park Offsite Levy Bylaw model.

- An Informal Briefing to Council was completed March 7, 2017 on the status update of drafting a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with Alberta Transportation. Administration shared the benefits of working collaboratively and the significant cost savings that can be achieved working with Alberta Transportation, and how this will have a positive effect on reducing our Transportation Levies and make the region more competitive with in place infrastructure to support Development.
- Design and land acquisition is now complete, and Alberta Transportation prepared a MOA in December 2018 which reflects details discussed in meetings between Administration and Alberta Transportation.
- Specific improvements within this MOA are shown within Attachment 2
  of the Request for Decision (RFD). Attachment 1 of the RFD shows this
  improvement area and the location in relation to the Highway network.
- The MOA includes grade widening and realignment of approximately 4.2km of Highway 825. Construction of 3 new intersection treatments accessing I4: Medium Industrial Serviced lands. Access to Boysdale Road will be from an improved intersection located at Highway 825 and Township Road 552. This also includes construction of approximately 2km of service road directing Industrial traffic to common improved intersections.
- The MOA proposes that the Province (Alberta Transportation) pay 75% of the described work, with Sturgeon County paying the remaining 25%. Invoicing will not occur until after January 31, 2020.
- If this project were to be funded as a stand-alone project (funded through Sturgeon County off-sites, based on current estimates in the current Off-site Levy Bylaw, these projects would cost a total of dollars.
- Sturgeon County, and the development community, through future off-site contributions, will benefit from a savings of approximately \$ dollars, subject to final costing, from this joint tendering opportunity. Severed in line with Section 25 of the FOIP Act
- A new internal service road will be constructed to gain access to a new intersection located at Township Road 553. This internal roadway will be able to support future asphalt surfacing when development of the adjacent parcels occurs. This service road is not included within the Offsite Levy estimates above and would have been at the full cost to the future developer; however, a further cost savings of approximately \$800,00 was achieved following Administration working with the existing landowner to dedicate the lands for the service road at no cost to Alberta Transportation.
- Intersection improvements and service road construction allow future developers to obtain Roadside Development Permits from Alberta

Severed in line with Section 25 of the FOIP Act Transportation without having to front end infrastructure, which would result in delays in development until these infrastructure improvements can be constructed.

# Implication of Administrative Recommendation

#### **Strategic Alignment:**

# Organizational:

Working collaboratively with Alberta Transportation allows multiple roadway improvements to be managed under one contract leading to more competitive pricing. Administration will review construction progress reports, rebilling invoices from Alberta Transportation and ensuring roadways for future Sturgeon County ownership are constructed to our Municipal Servicing Standards.

Reconstruction of roadways and asphalt surfacing will reduce maintenance requirements for Sturgeon County operations.

Realignment of the connection to Boysdale Road from Highway 825 will remove the section of existing gravel along Boysdale Road, which is a maintenance concern for operations.

#### Financial:

The project will be funded from Offsite Levy Recovery Reserve. Recovery of front-ended funds are placed in this reserve. The funds in this reserve are intended for paying for the County's share or front-ending of offsite infrastructure projects.

The recovered front-ended funds for road infrastructure projects are estimated at \$\frac{1}{2}\text{Extraction} \text{ from Sturgeon Industrial Park and Alberta Industrial Heartland. Severed in line with Section 25 of the FOIP Act

Administration will update the Sturgeon Industrial Park Offsite Levy Bylaw to incorporate these cost savings.

# Alternatives Considered

Council does not authorize the signing of the Memorandum of Agreement between Alberta Transportation and Sturgeon County for the widening of Highway 825. This would bring uncertainty of Alberta Transportation moving forward with the tendering Highway 825 Widening or moving forward with reconstruction of Highway 825 without including any of the improvements within the Sturgeon Industrial Park Offsite Levy Bylaw.

# Implications of **Alternatives**

# **Strategic Alignment:**

This alternative is not consistent with any Focus Areas within the Strategic Alignment.

### Organizational:

Administration will continue to request developers, through the Development Agreement Process, to construct infrastructure improvements as required by Alberta Transportation and Sturgeon County.

## Financial:

Transportation estimates within the Sturgeon Industrial Park Offsite Levy Bylaw will remain and no cost savings for the Offsite Levy will be achieved. This will be a loss opportunity for Sturgeon County, and future land developers, to save approximately \$ dollars.

Severed in line with Section 25 of the FOIP Act

Follow up Action 1. Memorandum of Agreement will be signed by Sturgeon County and Alberta Transportation.
