

## **Request for Decision**

Title	Contract Awarding for Solar Opportunities
Proposed Motion	That Council award the design, supply and installation of a solar photovoltaic system at the Protective Services Building to SkyFire Energy Inc. in the amount of \$188,409 plus GST, contingent on receiving \$86,649 in funding from the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre (MCCAC), with Sturgeon County's contribution of \$101,760 plus GST to come from 7.2 Contingency Reserve.
Administrative Recommendation	That Council award the design, supply and installation of a solar photovoltaic system for the Protective Services Building to SkyFire Energy Inc. in the amount of 188,409 plus GST with funding to come from the 7.2 Contingency Reserve. Project execution would be contingent upon receiving a 30% rebate commitment from the MCCAC including the additional first-time installation bonus rebate (the estimated total contribution would be \$86,649).
Previous Council Direction	March 12, 2019 Motion 069/19: That Council authorize Administration to proceed with a Request for Proposal related to the installation of solar facilities on County buildings eligible for existing MCCAC grants. Motion 068/19: That Council authorize Administration to investigate solar opportunities on County buildings what would be eligible for existing Municipal Climate Change Action Centre (MCCAC) grants.
Report	<ul> <li>Background Information</li> <li>The County's current buildings are connected to the existing power grid.</li> <li>Electricity received is subject to baseload operations that are currently feeding the grid.</li> <li>Currently in Alberta, roughly 30% of all generated electricity comes from coal-fired generation. Gas plant generation is the next highest producer, with a small percentage of generation attributed to wind solar and biomass generation.</li> </ul>

	History
	<ul> <li>Over the last several years, solar opportunities have been discussed but a more thorough review has not been undertaken by Administration.</li> </ul>
	• Solar installations have become more prevalent with the reduction in solar panel pricing.
	• Grants such as the rebates from the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre (MCCAC) have allowed municipalities to access required capital, easing the initial burden on installation.
	• General public sentiment has changed over the last several years with individuals expressing support for utilizing responsible renewable energy alternatives.

	• The County received four proposals from interested vendors through the Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC).
	<ul> <li>Using a scoring matrix that involved several qualifying factors (including cost), Administration determined that SkyFire Energy Inc was the most successful bidder.</li> </ul>

	• The solar photovoltaic system tender was advertised on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC).
	• The tender was open for 3 weeks and closed April 18, 2019.
