Previous Council Direction	• The development of the Community Standards Bylaw is a corporate initiative under Goal 2.3 of the County's 2019-2021 Corporate Business Plan.				
	• At the July 9, 2019 Committee of the Whole meeting, Administration presented the proposed draft Community Standards Bylaw.				
	• At the August 28, 2018 Committee of the Whole meeting, Administration presented initial findings surrounding the formation of a Community Standards Bylaw.				
Report	Background Information				
	• For the past several years, requests for service have been received by Protective Services and issues raised with members of Council surrounding noise, unsightly properties, number of animals on a property, outdoor storage, etc.				
	<ul> <li>Various discussions have been held by staff and Council over several years surrounding the viability of a Community Standards Bylaw to guid issues raised by the public (residents, property owners, and visitors).</li> </ul>				
	• The Community Standards Bylaw can address areas not currently contemplated within the Land Use Bylaw.				
	• As part of the 2018 Department Business Plan, Protective Services committed to conducting research into how other municipalities are addressing issues typically found within a Community Standards Bylaw.				
	• In a collaborative approach with the assistance and support of Development Services, preliminary research was conducted, and a report of findings was compiled. These findings were presented to Council at the August 28, 2018 Committee of the Whole meeting.				
	Collaborative work has continued over the last several months with meetings between Agriculture Services, Community Services,				

	Development Services and Protective Services, the culmination of which has resulted in the proposed Community Standards Bylaw.				
	• Subsequent to the July 9, 2019 Committee of the Whole presentation to Council, the draft bylaw was forwarded and reviewed by legal services.				
	• As outlined in the previous presentation to Council and again today, perhaps the most important message is that this bylaw does <i>not</i> include land zoned Agricultural.				
	<ul> <li>Administration recommends that such a bylaw be applicable only to Sturgeon County areas districted (zoned) Residential except for Part VI – Noise. Administration is recommending this section be made applicable throughout the County, thus providing the RCMP and County Enforcement a mechanism to deal with such complaints.</li> <li>Inclusion of Part VI - Noise does not apply to bona fide Agricultural Practices.</li> </ul>				
	External Communication				
	• Development of this bylaw aligns to similar bylaws in place within many of the regional municipalities. This bylaw is meant to provide benefits to residents in addition to guidance. It provides a mechanism to deal with several items that currently are a challenge to address in addition to providing enforcement abilities.
