Title	Fire Services Cost Recovery
Proposed Motion	1. That Council endorse the recovery of Fire Department expense charges relating to insured perils.
	2. That Council direct Administration to engage a third-party company to recover discretionary Fire Department expense charges from the respective insurance company, not individual policyholders.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council endorse the recovery of Fire department expense charges relating to insured perils and authorize Administration to engage with third-party vendors.

Report	of fire service expenditures in Sturgeon County.           Background Information
	• On October 23, 2018, Council received a presentation from a company called Fire Marque. This presentation provided an overview of the services offered by Fire Marque in relation to invoicing, billing of residents and businesses who suffer a loss as a result of a fire.
	• At the February 12, 2019, Regular Council Meeting, Council directed Administration to amend applicable bylaws for Council deliberation allowing for the recovery of fire service expenditures in Sturgeon County.
	<ul> <li>Current County bylaws were reviewed. It was Administration's position that the current Fire Services Bylaw, Bylaw 1354/15, Section 10, supported by the County Fees and Charges Bylaws 1427/18 and 1435/19, already adequately provided the ability to invoice and recover costs for fire service expenditures.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>In response to the Committee of the Whole presentation on June 25, 2019, Administration conducted further research surrounding additional fire service recovery options, with the following findings.</li> </ul>
	• The insured perils list is extensive and can cover incident types beyond residential fire, including tornadoes, plane crash, boat fires, explosions and other insured perils. In addition, non-residential (industrial, commercial and institutional) property policies also have potential fire department expense recovery mechanisms.
	• Third-party recovery services only action files that are forwarded by the respective municipality's fire division. This enables the municipality to maintain complete discretionary control as to which files are actioned.
	• One of the general principles of third-party recovery services is that, "They want to add to a Municipalities Revenue Stream, not impair it." Items that are currently invoiced will continue with no change to current procedures.
	• Administration believes that Sturgeon County's Fees and Charges Bylaw allows for a third-party cost recovery mechanism. However, if Council approves the additional recovery of fire service fees related to insurance perils and the bylaw is insufficient, Administration will bring back any required amendments for Council's consideration.
	• Administration's additional research confirmed that any additional fee recovery would be recovered directly from insurance companies, not the policyholders.

	• If the fire cost recovery motion is endorsed by Council, Administration will follow our current procurement practice in selecting a qualified vendor to pursue insured peril recovery under the County's discretion.

Implication of	Strategic Alignment:
Administrative Recommendation	• Strong Local Governance and Regional Leadership – Endorsement of the recovery of fire-related expenses from insured perils provides the County an opportunity to maximize billing opportunities on behalf of the fire department by invoicing insurance companies for the costs of fire department attendance with respect to insured perils.

	Organizational:
	There will be little impact to the organization as a third party is recommended to be engaged to handle all the billing requirements.
	<u>Financial:</u>
	There will be no negative financial impact to the County as current third- party vendors typically collect a percentage of a successful recovery. It is not anticipated that there will be any retainer or additional fees associated with engaging a third-party vendor.
Alternatives Considered	Council could decide not to proceed with additional recovery of fire-related expenses and continue with the current status quo procedure.
